Course Description	This qualification is part of the Horticulture Training Package. This qualification underpins a range of work functions and job roles that can lead to a horticultural qualification with a focus on the landscaping industry. It provides students with the skills and knowledge needed to work under supervision as a killed operator or assistant to a tradesperson in the horticulture industry that is focused on the landscaping industry. Students complete a range of general horticulture and landscape units and may choose electives from a range on industry specific modules.																																																
Pathways	Completion of the Horticulture - Landscaping Course leads to a landscape tradesperson likely to be involved in working independently or as part of a team in carrying out landscape work. Job titles may include: Horticulture Worker, Horticulture Assistant, Landscape Labourer or Landscape Trades Assistant.																																																
Entry Requirements	Students in Year 11 must have a strong interest in Horticulture/Landscaping and a moderate level of Literacy and Numeracy.																																																
Other Requirements	Students will need to supply their own personal protective equipment (PPE) in the form of: long sleeve top, long pants/trousers (shorts are not acceptable), safety shoes/boots, safety vest (hi vis vest), safety glasses and heavy duty gardening gloves.
